



## General Show Rules

1. All horses must be registered with PHBA and registration papers must be presented when entering. Owner, youth, amateur, and open exhibitors must present their current PHBA membership card. **You must present a current negative coggins report on each horse entering the show grounds or the horse will not be allowed to remain on the show site.**
2. All **Amateur** exhibitors must meet PHBA horse ownership requirements.
3. **Novice** - Any person who has not earned an overall total of fifty (50) points in any/all divisions of PHBA.
4. To be eligible for **OPEN** High-Point horse for the circuit, the horse must be shown each day in a minimum of 3 open classes of which at least two (2) are open performance classes. Entries not shown will not count towards eligibility. Any class entered that has been canceled due to lack of entries will not count towards this requirement.
5. To be eligible for **YOUTH** and **WALK-TROT 5-9** High-Point horse for the circuit, the horse must be shown each day in a minimum of three youth classes of which two (2) are youth performance classes. Entries not shown will not count towards eligibility. Any class entered that has been canceled due to lack of entries will not count towards this requirement.
6. To be eligible for **Amateur** High-Point horse for the circuit, the horse must be shown each day in a minimum of three amateur classes of which two (2) are amateur performance classes. Entries not shown will not count towards eligibility. Any class entered that has been canceled due to lack of entries will not count towards this requirement.
7. To be eligible for **Amateur Select** High-Point horse for the circuit, the horse must be shown each day in a minimum of three amateur select classes of which two (2) are amateur select performance classes. Entries not shown will not count towards eligibility. Any class entered that has been canceled due to lack of entries will not count towards this requirement. Select Amateurs that show in an amateur class as well as their respective amateur select class, the amateur class will not count toward the high point. If the amateur select class does not have enough horses and the exhibitor shows in the amateur class, then the points for that class will count towards the amateur select high point.
8. To be eligible for **Novice Amateur** High-Point horse for the circuit, the horse must be shown each day in a minimum of three novice amateur classes of which two (2) are novice amateur performance classes. Entries not shown will not count towards eligibility. Any class entered that has been canceled due to lack of entries will not count towards this requirement. Novice Amateurs that show in an amateur class as well as their respective novice amateur class, the amateur class will not count toward the high point. If the novice amateur class does not have enough horses and the exhibitor shows in the amateur class, then the points for that class will count towards the novice amateur high point.



9. All **Youth** and **Amateur** category High-Point awards are calculated on a one horse, one rider basis.
10. Circuit High-Points are open to all PHBA members whose memberships are currently in good standing with PHBA.
11. **Halter and color points will count for open, youth, and amateur circuit high-point.**
12. Points for circuit High-Point and Year End Awards will be based on the PHBA point system.
13. Classes with less than three (3) entries will be combined or canceled at the discretion of the show management.
14. **All Halter Class entries must be in by 8:30 A.M.**
15. **There will be no entries taken after the start of the last Trail class.**
16. Owner and Exhibitor must be a **HAPE** member or **associate** member to exhibit their horse.
